Meeting Minutes for Nov 16, 2024 Grand Strand Scale Modelers

- Filling in for Rick, Chaz called the meeting to order:
 - Chaz re-welcomed some old members that we hadn't seen in a while:

 - Meeting Focus:
 - New Bi-Laws will be addressed with Phil & Mike pertaining to cash disbursement in the event GSSM should ever dissolve.
 - The primary focus of the meeting was the planning for the Christmas Party & White Elephant Exchange.
 - Original date of 21 Dec was eventually changed to the 7th of Dec, 2024 so that more GSSM members could attend.
 - GSSM should be able to supply sandwiches as the main course.
 - Chaz will supply plates, cutlery, napkins, cups, paper towels, & trash bags
 - Scott Vanetten offered chips/snacks,
 - Jason Boggans will supply beverages
 - Phil Cavender will bring table cloths as well as a vegetable tray.
 - It was suggested that all others should bring a dish/treat to pass.

This kit has track links with separate guide horns to be glued on. Looks like he finished in the standard dunkelgelb....



Look out Mr. Davis!!











