Show & Tell

Herb's offering was the Tamiya KV-1(b) beautifully finished with Friulmodel tracks and excellent work on the diorama base with addition of miniart signs and scrathbuilt fences! Herb informed us that this particular model was omitted from a competition as a 'judge' noticed that a track pin was too shiny! Now THAT is rivet counting at its finest. He also had some other resin displays finished to a high quality, as always from Herb!





Mr Brown brought in a '47 Ford Station wagon, unsure of the brand as this one had been finished some time ago, took a spill from its display shelf and had some damage and a lot of interior detail was knocked about a bit, nice wood paneling. Nice detailing and a well finished model!



Earl completed the Revell 32nd scale ME-110 with his own custom mix to accurately capture the German paint used on this aerial menace. Well finished and paint work looks the part, nice job!





Rene brought us in a selection of N-Gauge items many of which were scratch built or piece built from existing small scale parts, amazing details achieved in these incredibly small units. My eyes are barely even up to looking at em let alone working on them!



Scott was rolling in the TD's in the form of the fearsome Dragon 1/35 scale German STUG III which looks this good and is entirely plastic! No PE in sight here!! All 175 pieces to assemble this Axis menace were beautifully finished with Vallejo acrylics with particular attention paid to the tools in place, superb job! This particular kit is provided with the mounting rail for the side skirts, but the skirts are not part of the kit, go figure.



Harry was back working some automotive alchemy with his Revell Mustang Boss '302. Nicely finished in Calypso Coral with a barefoil window trim (his first time attempting!). Decals were a challenge and fought hard all the way but with the aid of some decal softener they finally succumbed to his will. Ford thought of everything back in the day and even provided a toothpick to keep the hood open (5)





Mr Volentine provided us with a duo of F-16's, each as pretty as the next. Hasegawa kits, he modified the provided 'D' version and opted to build it as a 'B' to emulate birds his father flew in. Beautifully finished and weathered a fitting tribute to his dad. Example deux was the YF-16 Viper with modelmaster paints — very nicely done.







Dayne entered the fray with a Knights of Sidonia Mecha finished to his usual high standard breathing life into this plastic beast with some very lifelike chipping and beautiful finish. Another Mech to add to his growing army.





Mike presented us with an Eduard kit in 72nd scale for a change (3), the Polish Z-37 Čmelák with spray boom detail added to the bottom of the aircraft (3d printed after market parts). Nice paint work with yellow over a white primer and finished with some light pastel chalks to round out the finish.





Rick dabbled in another WingNut Wings kit this time around, the Pfalz D.XII, undeterred by the mind-bending lozenge decal on the wings Rick ploughed away and finished this 1/32 offering with aplomb and a beautifully finished wood effect prop rounded out this example to complement his demo on wood effects. Another fine example of a Wingnut classic. Nice job! He also showed off his latest tool purchase, the needle sharpener for airbrushes, only \$40! Available from all good bookstores ... well no, available only from www.sharpenair.com for the higher price of \$49.99 ... Rick got a bargain!



This month's offering from Jason is the Dragon T-34/76 with commander cupola. A decent build with large part count and an unbelievable amount of extra plastic. Finished with zinc chromate paint over black and green topcoats the build turned out pretty well.
