Meeting Minutes for June 15, 2024 Grand Strand Scale Modelers

June's meeting was held at the Socastee County Library starting at 10:30 AM, June 15th. There were **14** members in attendance.

- Rick called the meeting to order:
 - Rick welcomed all members and asked if anyone had pressing issues to add to the meeting's agenda.
 - The meeting focused on:
 - Reschedule of the July meeting to July 27th due to conflicts with Nationals and DownEastCon events/competitions. Regular schedule will return on August 17th.
 - BeachCon 2025
 - Scheduled for **29 March 2025**.
 - Primary Theme : *The Pacific Rim* including conflicts and non-conflict entry options. This includes military and civilian (cars, ships...) items associated with the Pacific hemisphere.
 - Flyer Discussion Less "noise"...cleaner look. Mike is working on the flyer.
 - Presently, the General Robert H. Reed Recreation Center is still the front runner, however, there is still the table rental issue.
 - 45 rectangular tables are needed for the event.
 - Re-combine contest and vendor areas.

 - Implement Electronic Registration for 2025 & Payments. (Phil/Rick)

In any event, nice work Rick!!


Art imitating life, Jason finished his first IPMS USA review. Though there were good and bad points to the ICM collection of Maultiers he finished the build. Jason stated that ICM had combined three original kits into a single offering and a couple of the kits were "showing their age".

Pretty nice job though....as his finished entries look pretty much like the box art!! Nice job Jason, I look forward to reading the review once it gets published at the <u>IPMS USA</u> website!!

....but wait, there's a straggler!! In his spare time he managed to finish off a Panzer IV from Tamiya.

Overall, a pretty busy build bench for Jason!!

Scott brought in some additional items from his display case.... First up was the 1/25th 55 Nomad offering from AMT. He put in 6 days of detailing to get his 'WOMPIN WAGON just right!!

Then, he called for Revell's 1/25th wrecker. Believed to be the old "Midnight Cowboy" boxing. Scott used the build to "put some time in" without heavy detailing....

An Airfix 1/24th Bf 109E was his next victim.... Suffering only some minor cowling issues, he was pleased with the build overall!!



Chad gave up on his nat metal F-86 (at lease temporarily) and focused on a couple heavy hitters!! Hasegawa's 72nd AV-8B offering was constructed out of the box. Chad spent some extra time on weathering as those things are "dirty birds"!!

Italeri's RF-4C/E kit (also in 72nd scale) was the impetus for a Bergstrom based RF-4E. Reskit burner cans, wheels and cockpit were used to enhance the appearance of this recce bird. Vallejo and Tamiya paints were used on the kits and the results are stunning!!!

Very Nice!!!





Dayne arrived with some friends. Very impressive with the use of Tamiya and Testor's Metalizer paints to achieve the worn appearance on both "soldiers". I think they may be Ukranian special operators.....





A new tooled Airfix Gloster Meteor Mk.8 in Aussie markings was on the ramp for Mike's latest build. Representing a Korea era RAAF AC from 77th Sqn it depicts the kite flown by Sgt George Hale who was credited for 1 & ½ MIG kills in, to date, the last air battle flown by the RAAF.

Of course it's in 72nd scale.....what else would it be in??

Mike also brought a target in for review. Vespid Models 1/72 Russian T-90. Highly detailed, we expect a nice representation soon as he acquired some modern Ruskie crew figures too. I smell a diorama!!





Not to be left behind.....Jordan dragged something out of his stash from many, many, many moons ago!! Straight from the box (as if there was any other way to build a FROG kit...) Jordan made a good representation of the TA-152....but especially the paint scheme. The rolling waves on the leading edge are there. Not easy in any scale....

He used 3rd party decals as well as Mr Hobby Aqueous hobby color paints and clear coat to accomplish the build!

I think the very last time I saw this kit built.....I was in my teens!!!

Demonstration Notes

Just how does John Davis get that super shine on his cars. John gave us about a 40-minute demonstration on how he's able to get such a polished sheen that attracts gold and silver medallions...



John explained that prep time is extremely important. First, prepping the vehicles with Dawn dishwashing liquid.

His tools of the trade consist of 4000 Flex-Pad sanding items, White Putty of both Tamiya and Squadron varieties.

John decants the Tamiya White Primer to prepare the body for painting.

He then uses Tamiya clear lacquer to cover the original paint color. Placing the body in a dust free environment and gives it all two weeks to harden.

Once the finish has hardened, John will re-inspect the finish. He can wash & dry with a fabric softener if desired.

Afterward, he utilizes an old handkerchief (or similar cloth) along with WD-40 (nonpenetrating) to polish the finish even further. 8000 sandpaper may also be used after the rub-down.

John continues the process until he feels the finish is just right.

After a non-Ammonia Windex wipe down, it's ready for decals!





Lastly, if anything goes wrong the body, or any part thereof, can be stripped with either Castrol Brake Fluid and/or Castrol Super Clean.

Again, start the entire process over with Dawn Dishwashing liquid....



John also utilizes Ultra-Restore Plastic Polish from Innovative Hobby Supply


