A ZM F-4E that the inlets just aren't right. A large gap, and I swear that I followed the directions and dry fit everything before hand. I have two Eduard Spitfires that the wing root isn't right. Generally, I attach the top wing to the wing root first, before attaching the lower wing. But, no.... I thought this time will be different, but it wasn't. So, off to the shelf of doom. I may finish them one day, but I just chalk up to lessons learned. So, what do you guys do. Do you finish every model you start?

Also, I recently came across a stash of models, about 100 all told. However, about 90% Of them had been started, some close to completion. This builder would start on a kit, lose interest, and start another one. And, in essence, would bounce around his stash of kits with the goal of completing them all. Well, he decided he didn't want them anymore and was looking for folks to take them off his hands. A lot ended up in the trash bin. Don't be this guy.

The 2nd of February (2024) marked the "official" first flight of the F-16! 50 years sure passed in a blink of an eye, but do you remember the plethora of kits that became available?

Thou not officially introduced to the general public until August of 1978 I remember my first F-16 kit.... The Revell version...waitthat's the prototype....ah, here comes Italeri's offering!! Ah, now that's.... wait....oh, the A/B version....the XL, Cranked Arrow....etc..etc.. Between all the brands, and variants, you suddenly had ten F-16 kits and not one of them were "accurate".

Just last year I bought the Tamiya 1/72 CJ-Block 50 with all the trimmings. Maybe I'll build this one as I think I may have only built one from the original stash. Here we go again!!





Just the other day, Italeri announced the release of their F-35C with folding wings. Wait, you mean...nope, the A and B wings do not fold. There are "Beast Mode", international versions, and clean wings too!! Wait until the MLUs come out.....and I'm sure there'll be a "G" variant, eventually.

This is why I kinda stopped buying modern aircraft kits. The configurations change so quickly, and they kept hanging silly new antennas, flare, and chaff dispensers all over the place. IR balls,

weapons, ECM & "sniper" pods too..... Are your Turkey Feathers retracted, expanded, or missing (F-15s)?

I have to admit, I was looking into Tamiya's 72nd F-35A but fortunately I am not in a hurry to have one on the shelf as it may be a while as I still have some Vietnam era and WWII birds in the pipeline. Show & Tell




Rick is first up with a personal tribute to an F-104B he had some familiarity with in days of old. Using the Hasegawa 1/48th scale example he Dayglo'd it using MRP's brand. Rick says it's the best example of Dayglo Orange he's ever worked with..... Even candy-striped the Pitot/Static tube.....

His entry into the group build is the Tamiya Fw 190F-8 also in quarter scale. He should "flip" the schemes and do some "What Ifs". Some Dayglo Orange on an Fw 190 would be stunning.....;)



Herb regaled us with some pickings from his cabinet. Tamiya's 1/35 Sherman with Legend's sandbags. "Waiting for Orders" looks as though it's fall of '44 and deep in the thick of it. Looks like he's scheming up something new as well.... We'll keep an eye out for what's next.....







Earl, on the other side of the coin, assaulted us with Tamiya's King Tiger in 1/35th. This one has the Porsche Turret. Usually constructing aircraft, this one's Earl's entry into the group build. Very nice Earl!! Not to be out gunned, Scott "Magic Tracked" his way through the Ardens Offensive with Dragon's 35th scale Panther G Command Tank. Dressed "to kill", this Steel Wheeled variant is Scott's winning entry for the group build. Congrats Scott!!

Scott has also employs Payne's Grey watercolor (tube) and 4B (# 4 Black) pencils to get that dirty and worn look for the overall appearance.

Nice venture away from the usual Ruskie aircraft. Nice job Dayne....and nice to see ya!!









Jason's group build entry is the Kirin (Dragon?) 35th scale example of Sd.Kfz. 138/1 Ausf. H "Grille". Builds up into a nice example of the German's continued use of the Pz. 38(t) (ČKD LT vz. 38) Czech platform.

He also brought in ICMs 3 vehicle example of the Maultiers. I beilive he said that the kit was part of the IPMS/USA reviews and that he looks forward to digging into all that plastic!!









Using ALCLAD metals, with black base, he's had a devil of a time getting the mixed aluminum finish. Tape pulls and a rough finish has caused him stop and reflect.

Though many GSSM members offered their thoughts, there was no clear cause....or solution for the issue(s). Could be something in the translation after all....it is Heller.

Shame to have the issue(s) as it looks wellconstructed and that may be Hartman's post war mount. We'll see if he pulls this one out....or augers in.....
