Meeting Minutes for Sept 21, 2024 Grand Strand Scale Modelers



September's meeting was held at the Socastee County Library starting at 10:30 AM, Sept 21st. There were **12** members in attendance.

Rick called the meeting to order:

- Rick welcomed all members and asked if anyone had pressing issues to add to the meeting's agenda.
- The meeting focused on:
 - Reminder of October's Meeting being scheduled for October 12th due to library availability.
 - Mike Fleckenstein was at the meeting and performed his *Engraving Stone Walls* demonstration. Excerpt is included in this newsletter.
 - Personal / Family issues were discussed.
 - Nominations for GSSM Officers was discussed. Looking for volunteers, however, Rick is available for a second stint as Chaz nominated Jason/Jordan to serve as VP. Elections are forthcoming.

- A Gundam/Sci-Fi contest at Ed's in Conway is being considered. Herb and Phil C will talk with Ed for initial discussions.
- John Davis briefed on the auto contest in Simpsonville SC. He advised that there seemed to be a lot of "Home Cooking" in play so be aware.
- GSSM Treasury was recorded at \$3345.47 on the meeting's date.

BeachCon 2025

- It was agreed to (via hand vote) that a lot of 24 unboxed Atlantis P-39s (1/46th) would be purchased for give-a-ways and BeachCon raffle. Pricing is \$1.99 per copy plus shipping for the entire lot.
- Rick is calling for raffle donations. Aircraft are needed as the donation of kits were primarily armor.
- It was agreed to reduce the number of contest tables to a total of 38 and to bring ALL vendors back into the main venue. This is due to communications issues between the rooms and the reduced number of kits that were entered into the contest.
- We are looking for GSSM members to take on some BeachCon responsibilities. We need to spread out non-contest day jobs so we have a smooth implementation.

• Other Items

- September's Group Build contest was Road Rage!! John Davis was elected to judge all entries.
- o Kit Auction netted a total of \$137 to add to GSSM's coffers!! Way to go guys!

Demo: Engraving Stone Walls w/Mike Fleckenstein




Mike is planning a vignette for his newly acquired 1/72 scale MiniArt StuH 42 Ausf. G.

He begins with a resin stone road for the primary item attached to wood and foam but then he needed a facade for a bridge side to finish the terrain display.

Mike's tools consist of:

- Straight edge
- X-Acto knife
- Toothpick
- Various sandpaper
- Textured Items (rolled up tape, aluminum foil, plastic)

Mike likes to start with some foam core board. He usually picks his up at the dollar store and isn't really picky on the "newness" of the item as he's going to cut it up and peel off the paper layer to access the foam.

Mike defines his rows by use of a toothpick and a straightedge. He then rotates the straightedge 90 degrees so to draw/define the individual bricks/blocks. Take care to remember that constructed walls are usually staggered for strength and stability. Check your references accordingly.

Once he has the wall defined, he "textures" the façade by use of items that can give the wall a grainy effect. Rolled up tape, aluminum foil are perfect candidates to roll over the newly defined wall.

Using a straw, or other tools, he pushes some of the bricks inward to enhance the wall with lost bricks/blocks. Using an X-Acto blade, or other tools, cracks can be put into the blocks as well.

Color the facade any way you'd like. Again, refer to your references but usually a grey or brick red color will suffice. Remember to color the mortar lines in a different (tan or grey) paint color and don't forget to wash.....the wall with your favorite weathering products.


Show & Tell

He used Bare-Metal Foil for the Chrome and MCW's Mulsanne Blue for the car's finish. This is AMT's 1/25 scale representation of this classic vehicle. Nice Job Chad!!!





Another AMT (1/25) offering is this classic White-Freightliner SD/DD tractor cab that was Earl's *Road Rage* entry.

Beautifully attired, painted, and detailed, Earl has some personal attachments to this build.

Though not a Road Rage build.....Phil's build would certainly be ALL the rage if it was on the road! Look for his write up at the IPMS/USA Reviews page.




